About 800 families from Hyderabad district of Sindh in Pakistan have reached India on a visit for Kumbh Mela. They do not intend to go back to Pakistan. A Panjabi gentleman, Shri Nahar Singh has kindly put them in his school premises near IGI airport till they get the permission of the Govt. of India for their wish. They are in need of help in kind and cash. Many groups as well as individuals have come forward to help them. Your Society also has contributed Atta, Rice, Ghee, Cloths etc for them to the tune of about Rs.40,000.00. The things were distributed to the heads of the families on the spot by our President Mrs Chitra Sahjwani, Vice President Mr. N.K. Rupwani, Mr. Kishore Madhwani, Mrs. Rekha Madhwani, and Mrs. Savitri Bhawnani. We are in touch with them and would like to help them more. For this members are requested to contribute in cash and kind.

Fixing of rates for Maharaj : In Sindhi community Maharaj is supposed to perform all religious ceremonies. As such, all Panchayats and other

associations appoint a Maharaj to perform such duties. We have also appointed Maharaj Shyamlal Sharma for the society. Some members call him for various religious duties at various occasions. However, it is essential that all our members do avail of his services as and when required. Lately, the cost of livelihood has gone up because of increase in the prices of all the things. As such it was felt that the charges of Maharaj for different services required increase. We have now consulted Maharaj and have prescribed revised rates as given below:

Maharaj Shyamlal and his son Maharaj Sanjay will attend and perform all these ceremonies when called upon. Maharaj Shyamlal has also assured that he would distribute Rakhris on Raksha Bandhan and Patris on Diwali to all the members as was the practice in Sindh. The representatives of various sectors are requested to introduce Maharaj to all the members in their respective sectors to enable him to perform these two duties.

Ladies, who keep fast on Tijri, can visit Maharaj's place to listen Tijri's Katha there. Ladies can also arrange to listen the Katha at a place fixed by them and call Maharaj for the Katha. Guryani will oblige them and will come to read them Katha. Similarly who intend to listen Mahalaxmi's Katha can follow the above process and arrange to listen the Katha.

A Healthy Tip

You can enjoy that same Sindhi Phulka, Chahro Phulko, Satpuro, Koki, Mithi Loli with " Raw Extra Virgin Olive Oil or Canola Oil" if you are diabetic/ Heart Patient/ Obese or simply health conscious. Believe me! You will get almost the same taste along with the health benefits. Do not fry in Olive oil as the smoke point for olive oil is too low for deep frying. A lower smoke point doesn't allow you to get your oil hot enough to cook the food. Peanut or canola oil will work best for deep frying.

Recipe of Majoon (Ritu Gulabani)

Majoon, a nutritious Sindhi dish, is especially served in breakfast in winter along with milk. It is very filling and tasty. Many Sindhis abroad have replaced ghee with canola or palm oil to make it healthy. Sindhi ladies send especially this dish to their daughters after they have given birth to a child as it helps them to recover their health.

Cooking Time - 2 hrs 30 mins approximately

Ingredients Needed:

Milk - 1 & 1/2 liters

Sugar - 500 gms

Dry dates / Chuara - 125 gms

Poppy Seeds / Khus Khus - 150gms

Unsweetened Khoya - 500 gms

Cardamom powder - 2 - 3 tsps

Almonds / Badam - 250 gms

Cashew nuts - 250 gms

Pista - 125gms

Ghee - 400gms / Can be replaced by oil

Preparation: Select a very thick bottomed deep pan for cooking this as there is always a possibility for the milk to get burnt. While cooking you must check frequently so that the milk does not burn at the bottom of the pan.

Since dry dates are very hard, crush them using a stone or a hard object. Remove the pits. Similarly crush the nuts. Keep them aside.

Bring milk to boil, simmer. Continue boiling it for about 10-15 mins. Add sugar and let it dissolve. Add poppy seeds, cardamom powder, unsweetened khoya and crushed dry dates. Continue cooking for about 30 mins. When you check the dates, it should be little soft by now. Simmer till the milk is almost it's half. At this stage add the pounded nuts. Continue cooking on slow flame till the milk is absorbed by the khoya and other ingredients. The mix will start to look thick brown creamy mix. Take care to stir the entire mix, frequently, so that it does not burn in the bottom of the pan. After about 2 hrs or so, the entire mix is dry and all the moisture is gone. Start adding the ghee one spoon at a time and mix everything. When you find the moisture is completely gone and the ghee starts coming on the sides, place this pan on a griddle, cover with a lid and place a heavy object above it. Continue cooking for about 10 mins.

You will know it's done, when the nuts are soft and the mixture is brown in colour. This can be stored in the refrigerator and served for breakfast. Serving: 2-4 tbsp along with milk, warmed in microwave for 2 mins to get it piping hot and served for breakfast.

Saints of Sindh:

From the times unknown, Indus Valley Civilization (Sindhu Ghati Sabhyata) has been an identity and epitome of India. But after partition only a part from the name i.e. "Ind" was carried to India, our ancestral Indus was left for Pakistan. Very few know that our pure river valley is a witness to of a number of saints who gained enlightenment, wisdom and true spirituality. They had experienced divine grace, performed penance, and purified their souls. Friends, our Sindh has produced many saints whose followers today are widely spread throughout the world.

Dada Lekhraj

Lekhraj Khubchand Kripalani (15 December 1884–18 January 1969), also known as **Bhai** or **Dada Lekhraj**, was the founder and medium to the [Brahma Kumaris](#) movement, a movement that has been internationally recognized. He is also revered as [Brahma](#) Baba by his followers. He had a very humble beginning as the son of a school teacher.

Originally from [Hyderabad, Sindh](#), Dada Lekhraj became extremely wealthy through his business of precious stones and [jewellery](#). It was spread from Sindh to Kolkata. In his fifties, Dada reportedly had [visions](#) and so retired. He returned to Hyderabad in Sindh and turned to spirituality. In 1932, he established a spiritual organisation called "Om Mandali". He is said to have had 12 [gurus](#) but started preaching or conducting his own [satsangs](#) which, by 1936, had attracted around 300 people from the community, many of them being wealthy.

In 1936, he founded a Female School and then a Hostel in 1939. He started all this when purdah system was at its peak and females were allayed a lot. As a result he had to face a lot of opposition. Still the numbers of followers were on a rise and along with males, females had also joined the mission.

He strongly believed and preached that only a female can conserve and develop human values, freedom and civilization. He gave a lot of importance to female upliftment and education. He believed that along with education, a female should have values and spiritual knowledge so that she can cultivate a good citizen for the country.

After partition in 1947, the mission was established in Mount Abu on 30th May, 1950. Along with spirituality, he promoted Vegetarianism, Celibacy, World Peace and Prohibition. From 1951 to 1968, he promoted his work in India and World. On 18th January, 1969 although he left his body; but his work and mission had gathered a momentum by then and is spreading the messages to masses even today.

Various establishments and institutions across the world have recognized the selfless service of Brahma Kumaris

which has been working for world peace and upliftment of humanity. Some are mentioned here.

- Brahma Kumaris is affiliated to the Department of Public Information(DPI) of the United Nations as a Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO)
- In the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) and the UNICEF of the UN, it holds the consultative status. The organization has an office at the UN
- The United Nations “University for Peace’ in Costa Rica receives its co-operation in the field of peace education by means of an official agreement
- The Government of Mauritius has recognized it as a University by an Act of Parliament
- The Government of Guyana has adopted the principle of starting the proceedings of their Parliament with three minutes Rajayoga Meditation as suggested by the institution
- The Brahma Kumaris has been awarded UN Peace Medals for 1981 and 1986 and Chief of Brahma Kumaris, Dadi Prakashmani, the head of the mission after Dada Lekhraj was awarded International Peace Messenger Award from Secretary General of UN in 1987. Five more National Peace Messenger Awards have also been received by Brahma Kumaris centres in Australia, Kenya, etc
- Dadi Prakashmani was honoured by Mohanlal Sukhadia University, Udaipur, India by conferring Doctorate Degree in Literature for her outstanding contribution to the cause of learning, spreading and development of spiritual, moral and human values
- The Chief of Brahma Kumaris was invited by the World Parliament of Religions to participate and deliver Presidential Address in its Centenary Celebrations at Chicago on 31st August 1993. She was also signatory to the Global Ethics Document adopted by the leaders of World Religions in the said programme.
